



Three Card Prime

Introduction: Three Card Prime is a house-banked poker-based game played with a standard 52 card deck. The object of the game is for the player to have a higher ranking poker hand than the dealer. Three Card Prime also contains optional bonus wagers that are not dependent on the base game's outcome.

Rules: Play starts with the player making Ante bet. The player may also place a bet on the optional Prime, Pair Bonus, All Six and Progressive wagers at this time.

Following is the ranking of hands from highest to lowest:

- Mini-Royal
- Straight Flush (Three Suited and Sequential Cards)
- Three Of A Kind
- Straight (Three Sequential Cards)
- Flush (Three Suited Cards)
- Pair
- High Card

Note: Ace is high except in 3-2-Ace sequence Mini Royal is A-K-Q suited

Optional Pair Bonus, All Six, Prime, and Mini Royal Progressive optional wagers.

While the Ante is mandatory, the Pair Bonus, All Six, Prime, and Mini Royal Progressive wagers are optional, players may make the Pair Bonus, the All Six or Prime wagers for any amount within the posted table limits. Players may bet more on the Pair Bonus, All Six, and Prime wagers than they bet on the ANTE. The Mini Royal Progressive wager shall be \$1.

Prior to receiving cards each player must make an Ante in the player's wagering spot. Player's may also place wagers on Pair Bonus, Prime, All Six and Progressive optional wagers.

Each player and the dealer receive three cards face down

After examining their cards, each player must decide to place a Play wager equal to their Ante wager, or fold and lose their Ante wager. All optional bonus wagers are still in play, even if the player folds.

The dealer's hand must be a Queen high or better to qualify. Player's and dealer's hands are then compared:

- If the dealer qualifies and The player's hand is higher than the dealer hand, the Ante and Play wagers win and are paid 1 to 1.
- If the player's hand ties the dealer hand, the Ante and Play wagers push.
- If the player's hand is lower than the dealer's hand, the Ante and Play wagers lose.
- If the dealer does not qualify the Ante wager wins and is paid 1 to 1 and the play wager pushes regardless of the player's hand.

Any player that has made a play wager will receive an Ante Bonus if their hand achieves a winning event in accordance with the Ante Bonus Paytable, regardless of the Ante and Play wagers outcomes.

After the primary wagers are settled the dealer will pay or take the Prime Bonus, the Pair Bonus, and then the All Six Bonus. The Progressive Bonus will be settled last as applicable.
