

Blackjack

Blackjack is played with a six-deck shoe, double-deck or even single deck. Rules are dependent on game type and limits vary from table to table.

The objective of the game is to beat the dealer by having a point total closest to 21 without going over.

Card Values:

- 2 through 10: face value
- All Face Cards: 10
- Aces: 1 or 11 (Count Aces as 11, unless it makes a bust)

Players win 3 to 2 odds when dealt a Blackjack (any Ace and a 10 value card) unless the Dealer is also dealt Blackjack - which is a "push"

When the Dealer shows an Ace, players can buy "insurance" for up to $\frac{1}{2}$ of their bet, paying 2 - to - 1 odds if the Dealer has Blackjack.

Dealer hits soft 17 (A, 6) and stands on all hard 17s.

A tie (no win or loss) is called a "push".

Players can "double down" after receiving their first two cards by doubling their bet and will receive a single card.

Players dealt pairs can split them up to four times, including Aces. A separate matching bet is required for each hand. In single deck and double-deck, players can split one time.

Players Edge - Blackjack

Player's Edge 21 is a variation of blackjack played using six or eight Spanish decks. (A standard 52-card deck with all the 10's removed). The object of the game is to beat the dealer by having a point total closest to 21 without going over, just as in standard Blackjack.

Players win on all blackjacks and are paid immediately regardless of dealer's hand value and are paid 3 to 2.

Any player whose initial two cards are a "Matched 20" (two King of Hearts for example) is an automatic winner and is paid even money.

Players win on all hands totaling 21 and are paid immediately

Doubling down on a three or more card soft 21 is permitted. Bonuses are not paid on doubled hands.

Players may split cards of equal value, including Aces, up to three times, creating up to four hands.



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Players may double double on any total, on 2, 3, 4 or more cards INCLUDING after splitting

Double Down Rescue: After doubling, players may choose to rescue (take back) the doubled portion of the bet and forfeit the original. Busted doubles CAN NOT be rescued.

Insurance is permitted. Players may bet up to $\frac{1}{2}$ the original bet, on any dealer's ace card showing, including a PAID blackjack. Players win 2 to 1 if the dealer has a blackjack and 5 to 1 if the dealer has a blackjack consisting of two cards of the same suit.

Surrender Allowed- a player cannot surrender against a dealer's blackjack. A player may surrender (forfeit) $\frac{1}{2}$ of his original bet, on his first two cards only, against any dealer up card. If the dealer up card is a face or ace, the dealer must check for blackjack, if the dealer does not have blackjack the player may surrender.

7-7-7-7 Bonus payouts are \$1,000 on a wager up to \$24 bet, or \$5,000 on a \$25 or higher

Aggregate payout for the table is \$20,000

*Bonus Jackpot prizes are paid by the casino and are not components of any progressive prize contest. Player wagers do not accrue to any guaranteed player fund. The displayed Bonus Jackpot prize may be modified or discontinued at any time without prior notice.

Lucky Ladies - Blackjack

Lucky Ladies Is an optional bet used in the game of Blackjack. The proposition is whether or not the player's first two cards equal a total of twenty. Additional bonuses are paid if the player's two cards equaling twenty are suited, (e.g. Ace of Clubs and nine of Clubs) or matched, (e.g. two identical cards such as two King of Diamonds). Special bonuses are awarded if the player's first two cards equaling twenty are suited, (e.g. Ace of Clubs and nine of Clubs) or matched, (e.g. two identical cards such as two King of Diamonds). Special bonuses are awarded if the player's first two cards are each a Queen of Hearts, (the "Lucky Ladies"), and the top prize is awarded if the player's Queen of Hearts pair occurs at the time the dealer has a Blackjack. Everyone plays against the dealer who starts the game by dealing each player two cards and himself one card up and one card down.

CARD COUNT

Tens, Jacks, Queens and Kings count 10 each. Aces count 1 or 11, as you choose. All other cards 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 count by their face value.

BLACKJACK

If your first two cards are an Ace and 10, Jack, Queen or King you have Blackjack. You collect one and a half times your bet.



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THE GAME

The object of the game is to draw cards that add up to 21, or as close to 21 as possible without going over 21 ("bust")

STAND OR HIT

After looking at your hand you can either "stand" (draw no more cards.)

OR you can signal the dealer to "hit" (give you additional cards) until you think your hand is closer to 21 than the dealer's. If your card count is nearer 21 than the dealer's you win. If it is less than the dealers you lose. TIES ARE CALLED "PUSHES." No one wins.

DEALER RULES

The dealer must "hit" (draw more cards) if his card count totals 16 or less.

The dealer must "stand" (draw no more cards) if his card count is 17 or more. Dealer must hit soft 17.

SPLITTING PAIRS

If the first two cards are a pair (two 4's, two 9's, etc.) you may "split" the pair into two separate hands. You do this by placing the same amount as your original bet on each hand. Split up to 4 times.

DOUBLING DOWN

You may "double down" on any original cards dealt to you. However, you get only one card on the "hit"

INSURANCE

When the dealer's upcard is an Ace, he or she will ask if you wish to buy "insurance." This means you can bet an additional amount, up to half of your original bet, that the "hole" (down) card is a ten count card. Thus, if you take "insurance" and the dealer has Blackjack your insurance bet pays off at 2 to 1. If the dealer's whole card is not a ten count card the "insurance" bet is lost and the game continues.
