

TERMINOLOGY

 MONEYLINE - To win the game straight up without the point spread. These wagers will include odds instead of a "spread"

EXAMPLE:

- PARLAY Two or more selections on the same ticket
- JUICE The amount charged by the Sportsbook for taking the wager or the "vig"
- **PUSH** When an event ends with no winner or loser for wagering purposes (event ends in a "tie")
- ACTION The wager is accepted (valid)
- COVER To win by more than the point spread
- **BETTING NUMBER** or "rotation number" the number associated with each team in order to place a wager. The betting number for each wager will be to the left of the team/wager on the betting sheets and odds TVs
- SPREAD Used to even the odds between two unevenly matched teams

EXAMPLE:

Team A-3 points vs Team B

For you to win the bet, Team A would have to win by MORE than 3. If they win by less than 3, the guest loses the bet. If they win by exaclty 3 then it is a push and your original wager is returned. If 101 Team A wins by 4 or more, you win.







Q: What games/sports are available?

A: The typical sports you can bet on in a Vegas sportsbook are available. Washington college sports, sports generally involving minors, and proposition wagers on whether someone will get injured will not be allowed.

Q: How do I place a wager?

A: You can place a wager at the Sportsbook window during operating hours or through any Sportsbook kiosk during casino hours of operation. After you place your wager you will receive a ticket that summarizes your wager. Keep this ticket and refer to it after the event(s) you wagered on as you will need it to claim any winnings. You can also wager off your winning tickets at the kiosk. The kiosk will accept winning tickets up to \$500.

Q: Can I cash out my winning ticket at a kiosk?

A: You can redeem your winning ticket for cash at any Sportsbook window or Cage cashier.

Q: What are the hours of the Sportsbook?

A: You can place a Sportsbook wager at any of the 8 Sportsbook kiosks located on the main Casino floor during casino hours.

Q: What forms of payment can I use to place a wager?

A: Cash is the only form of tender accepted for sports wagers. Should you place a cash wager at a kiosk and not spend the entire amount that was inserted, the kiosk will provide a ticket for the remaining amount.

Q: Do I earn LCCR Rewards points with my wager?

A: Yes! You earn points based on your wagering activity in the Sportsbook

Q: Can I redeem my LCCR Rewards points to place a wager in the Sportsbook?

A: Unfortunantely, no you can't
